Support That Honors the Pet and People Bond

We have been working to define how we can best serve our pet communities' needs. This means how we can streamline our services for the best use of available resources. Times are tough right now, and it's important to do what we think is right for pets in need, but also our donors. Responsible use of donations and volunteer support is a priority.

We have had to make some tough decisions when it comes to priority care and resources. The highest priority is to find a way to help pets who are in critical need of veterinary care. We are fortunate to have wonderful relationships with veterinarians in Comanche County, and even some specialty veterinary hospitals in the Duncan area.

When we have a case that we do not have the funding or staff to assist, we have begun to rely on referring these cases to other organizations who may have the resources needed to make a difference. We have worked to develop strong relationships with other animal welfare organizations, including the local animal shelters.

These relationships have driven the CCPRF program this year. From food donations for the pet food pantries, helping the homeless with pet supplies and care, the ability to provide free vaccines and assisting with finding temporary foster care.

One organization can't do it all. The local animal welfare organizations have begun to rely on each other to always be able to say "yes" to a pet family in need. It's been an amazing year and we are grateful for all our partnerships.

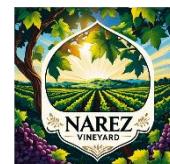
